GOALS & OBJECTIVES

Goal 1: FFP will provide a no-cost weekly menu of supplemental nutritious food to each low-income resident who qualifies for food assistance, and will coordinate with FSC to deliver that food for those who are mentally or mobility impaired, disabled, or otherwise constrained to the home

Actions/Outcomes:

During this quarter, the Fallbrook Food Pantry prepared and delivered 975 boxes of food, weighing an average of 45-55 pounds each! That's a lot of nutritional support provided weekly to low-income residents in our community who are mentally or mobility impaired, disabled, or otherwise constrained to the home!! This volume of food is more than twice what we anticipated could be provided.

Goal 2 & Objectives: From your application, please provide your measurable outcomes for each of your stated objectives.

Goal 2: FSC will create a nutritional needs assessment for prospective clients and will refer eligible clients to the Food Pantry to ensure that Fallbrook area residents are receiving the appropriate nutritional support they require to live independently and thrive in their homes. A home delivery service will be provided by FSC for those eligible homebound seniors and/or disabled

Actions/Outcomes:

During this quarter, the Senior Care Advocates at The Foundation for Senior Care conducted nutritional needs assessments with 17 seniors and/or disabled adults (38% of quarterly goal).

PARTICIPANT SUCCESS STORY

Participant Success Story:

One year prior to the pandemic, Tony & Sonya applied for government assistance through the county and were connected to the Fallbrook Food Pantry, at that time. "What a huge burden off of us, knowing that we would be getting financial assistance through food stamps, but also food from the Pantry". They are both disabled so when the Pantry started its home delivery service, several years ago, they felt blessed beyond belief. Then to begin receiving food from our volunteer driver, Pastor Brad, who delivers weekly sermons at the same local Fallbrook church that Tony & Sonya attend, they felt that God knew who they needed to show up for them. Tony & Sonya are so grateful for the services of the Pantry and everyone that makes this possible. They are so grateful for the variety of food and the fresh produce as well, that is their favorite part. They love the fresh fruits and veggies. For years they were supporters of the Pantry, and now they are receivers of all the good and kindness from the amazing people at the Fallbrook Food Pantry.
