REINS will submit attendance records for completion of all Continuing Education Sessions and records of improved skills of our students.

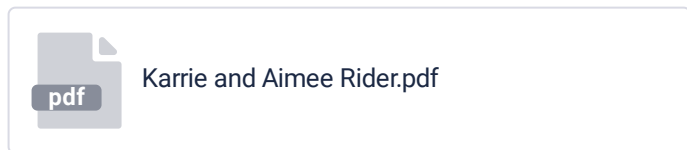
All PATH Certified Instructors attended Continuing Education session with Remy Hilchey, MA CCC-SLP Speech and Language Pathologist in October 2020.

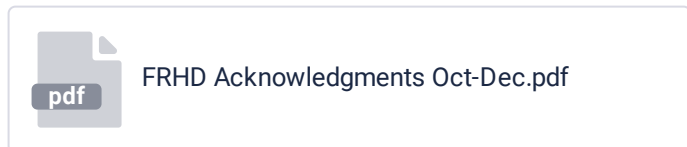

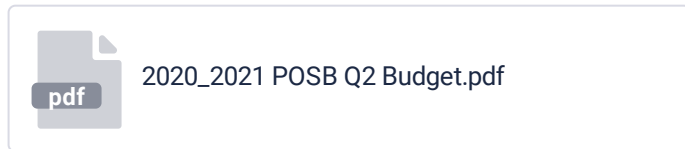
