FLC created a print trail map of Los Jilgueros Preserve, our 2nd most visited preserve and the preserve most used by District residents. This was provided to participants on the spring nature walk, as well as various other community members and organizations. This brochure is also available at the FLC office for anyone interested.

FLC staff have primarily made improvements to Dinwiddie and Monserate Mountain Preserves during this quarter. Staff and volunteers have corrected erosion issues on Dinwiddie Preserve that limited walkability. This trail is now able to be used by more seniors due to the improvements. FLC staff have also been enhancing the preserves by removing non-native vegetation, picking up litter and trash, and trimming vegetation to allow for safe trail use.




